School improvement and the External review

Term two saw significant time go into the External Review of our school. The final report is now available on our website http://www.millicenths.sa.edu.au but certainly supports the view that our school has been through a significant successful improvement process over the last four years since the 2017 review. We continue to put students at the centre of our decisions and put maximum energy into delivery of quality learning for all students. We have also worked hard to improve the wellbeing of our staff and students over the last four years. We have a great leadership team and teachers at the moment who are particularly committed to our literacy and numeracy improvement agendas. Word of the week (literacy and numeracy focused), TEEL, reading groups, student goals, and Colour folders in Maths are all examples of this improvement that occurred last term and will continue in term 3.

Parent involvement

At the end of last term we had our first whole school Gallery Walk on the afternoon of Tuesday the 29th of June with parents being invited to attend. Student work was on display and this was a new initiative to share what students are learning with parents and students in other year levels. The 'Gallery Walk' replaced our traditional whole school assembly last term. Stephanie Gilbert, our Numeracy / Maths / Science Coordinator was reappointed for a further five years, another great result for our school. Currently the panel process for the Principal's position, starting next year, is getting underway and we should know who the new principal is during this term.

to see.







CONSERVATION & LAND MANAGEMENT

Conservation and Land Management Students have been engaging in Natural Area Restoration works on Country. Connecting to Aboriginal Culture on the land and with a seasonal focus of Caring for Country. Students are learning about the landscape and also species ID through scats and tracks. This project has been funded by the Limestone Coast Grassroots Grant Landscapes SA.

CLM is an accredited Cert 2 Conservation and Land Management course through a school Visa Agreement with Tafe SA.











A group of very enthusiastic Year 9 and 10 female students travelled to Adelaide to participate in the Young Women in STEM program offered by the Adelaide University.

We travelled to Adelaide on Tuesday 8th June, on Wednesday morning we visited Adelaide University to join other students and their teachers from several other schools, at the Bonython Hall of the university, for an introductory presentation. There we learnt about opportunities in the fields of STEM available at the university.

For the rest of the day, students attended a number of sessions to learn about infectious diseases and the speed with which they are transferred, porosity of rocks, code cracking with an Enigma machine, which was used during the second world war, and creating climate resilient communities.

At the end of the day, we returned to Bonython Hall to hear some closing remarks and give the university feedback. Finally, we stopped to get dinner and drove to Millicent arriving back at the school at 9 pm.

The Young Women in STEM was a great opportunity for young female students to learn about different Mathematics, Science Technology and Engineering pathways and the importance of studying Mathematics and Sciences subjects in senior years. It was also a good opportunity for students to experience university life for a day and to meet like-minded female students from other schools.

Our students were great ambassadors for our school, and it was a real pleasure for us to accompany such an enthusiastic group of female students on this camp.
